The SIP is a clinical interview to assess symptoms of PTSD corresponding to DSM-IV criteria along with survival and behavioral guilt. Symptoms can be rated for the past 4 weeks and during the worst period ever.

PTSD Assessment Instruments

In addition to assessing the 20 DSM-5 PTSD symptoms, questions target the onset and duration of symptoms, subjective distress, impact of symptoms on social and occupational functioning, improvement in symptoms since a previous CAPS administration, overall response validity, overall PTSD severity, and specifications for the dissociative subtype (depersonalization and derealization).

PTSD is a serious public health problem that causes significant suffering and contributes substantially to health care costs. A complex biopsychosocial condition, PTSD is characterized by a combination of three types of symptoms: 1) Hyperarousal symptoms, such as hypervigilance, anxiety, and sleep disturbance.

Also included in this manual is a module for traumatic bereavement. This module is not included as one of the 12 sessions but could be added to the therapy. We recommend that the session be added early in therapy, perhaps as the second session along with the educational component on posttraumatic stress disorder.

The final manual is generally consistent with EAGALA guidelines, 44.45 which emphasize experiential learning and exploration through interactive equine grounding exercises (i.e., relaxation exercises encouraging attunement and focus on the present moment).

Statistics About PTSD. Many veterans are diagnosed with PTSD, so please know that you're not alone. In fact: About 11 to 20 out of every 100 veterans (or between 11% and 20%) who served in operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom have PTSD each year. About 12 out of every 100 Gulf War Veterans (or 12%) have PTSD each year.
