### Jaguar XK 120 - Worlds Fastest Production Car of the Early ...

By 1950, Jaguar began building OTS bodies in steel. A year later, in March of 1951 at the Geneva Auto Show, Jaguar launched the FHC. The FHC was clearly an attempt to broaden the appeal of the XK120 line by enclosing the passenger cabin for foul weather, a nod to practicality in this, the ultimate sports car.
